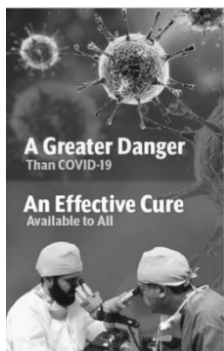

Message Title: **Good Father**

Matthew 7:7-12 | Sunday AM, July 19th, 2020 | Pastor Jack Lamb

7 Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. **8** For everyone who asks receives, and he who seeks finds, and to him who knocks it will be opened. **9** Or what man is there among you who, if his son asks for bread, will give him a stone? **10** Or if he asks for a fish, will he give him a serpent? **11** If you then, being evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask Him! **12** Therefore, whatever you want men to do to you, do also to them, for this is the Law and the Prophets.

Introduction

Sermon Application Questions

What do the terms “ask, seek, knock” teach us about prayer?

Does God place any limits on prayer? If so, what are they?

How would you respond to someone who says that God is not answering their prayers?

Discuss the difference between: (1) Don't treat others how you don't want to be treated, and (2) Treat others the way you want to be treated.

BE A DOER. Your responsibility, by God's enabling, is to consistently apply the divine principles and truths you have heard (Phil 2:12-13; 1 Tim 4:7-9; James 1:22-27). As you meditate on this message, ask yourself these questions: (1) How does God want my beliefs/actions to change? (2) How can I accomplish this change? (3) What is the first step toward bringing about this change?
