- 1. How would you encourage someone who was waiting on God?

- 4. Will the fact that God offers forgiveness by His mercy lead to loose living? Why/why not?
- 5. How can we deepen our daily awareness of God's tender mercy toward us?
- 6. Agree/disagree: No one can become a Christian without bending their will to God. How can we be clear about this when sharing the gospel?
