### Message Title: What's Wrong with the World?

Genesis 3:1-7 | Sunday AM, January 17<sup>th</sup>, 2021 | Pastor Jack Lamb

1 Now the serpent was more cunning than any beast of the field which the Lord God had made. And he said to the woman, "Has God indeed said, 'You shall not eat of every tree of the garden'?" 2 And the woman said to the serpent, "We may eat the fruit of the trees of the garden; 3 but of the fruit of the tree which is in the midst of the garden, God has said, 'You shall not eat it, nor shall you touch it, lest you die.' " 4 Then the serpent said to the woman, "You will not surely die. 5 For God knows that in the day you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." 6 So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree desirable to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate. She also gave to her husband with her, and he ate. **7** Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves coverings.

### **Sermon Application Questions**

- 1. Since deception is "tricky," how can we be on guard against it?
- 2. Temptation calls us to doubt who God is, and to defy his call on our lives. Where in life are you most tempted this way? How has God provided help for you to fight these temptations?
- 3. What things did Eve perceive to be desirable in the fruit she was forbidden to eat by God? What connection can be made between desire and disobedience?
- 4. Will a Christian suffer the temporal consequences of his sin the same as an unbeliever?
- 5. What has been most helpful to you in fighting temptation?

**BE A DOER**. Your responsibility, by God's enabling, is to consistently apply the divine principles and truths you have heard (Phil 2:12-13; 1 Tim 4:7-9; James 1:22-27). As you mediate on this message, ask yourself these questions: (1) How does God want my beliefs/actions to change? (2) How can I accomplish this change? (3) What is the first step toward bringing about this change?
