## **Sermon Application Questions**

- 1. What does it mean to be favored by God? How is seeking God's favor in this Psalm different than prosperity gospel preaching?*
- 2. Seeking God's blessing could result in selfishness, where we squander those blessings on ourselves. How can we avoid this?*
- 3. How could we pray specifically for the spread of God's salvation?*
- 4. Should we wait to give to missions until we feel that we have experienced God's blessing, or is giving one way to experience His blessing?*
- 5. How are we as a church (or you as an individual) fulfilling our role of being God's priest to the people of the world? (1 Peter 2:9)*

**BE A DOER.** Your responsibility, by God's enabling, is to consistently apply the divine principles and truths you have heard (Phil 2:12-13; 1 Tim 4:7-9; James 1:22-27). As you meditate on this message, ask yourself these questions: (1) How does God want my beliefs/actions to change? (2) How can I accomplish this change? (3) What is the first step toward bringing about this change?
